What is Biodiversity?

Biodiversity the **variety** of **life** on **Earth**. It includes all the different kinds or **species** of living things, as well as the larger **communities** that are composed of them and the smaller **populations** and **genes** that they contain It is is essential to the **functioning** of all ecosystems and to the continuing **evolution** of ecological communities as they respond to environmental change.













Why Is Biodiversity Important?

The **ecosystem services** that humans depend on for **food** and **health** depend on biodiversity. These include **pollination**, waste recycling, replenishment of soil fertility, pest and disease control, erosion control and provision of clean air and water. When **biodiversity** is **reduced**, **efficiency** of these processes is **reduced**, harming humans and other species.

What is the Role of Insects in Biodiversity?

Of all of the **species** or **kinds** of **living things** that have been named, over **half** (58%) are insects. Especially on land, in fresh water, and in the air, the **variety** of different **body forms** and **special structures** of insects allow them to **do work** and **perform tasks** that no other species can. If just a few key **ecological groups** or **guilds** of insects were to **disappear**, most **terrestrial and freshwater ecosystems** would **collapse, ruining human civilization.**







Biodiversity, Insects and the Monarch Butterfly (2)

What is the Biodiversity Crisis?

The **Biodiversity Crisis** is the **sudden and unprecedented decline** in biodiversity due to human activities. According to the landmark 2021 United Nations report *Making Peace With Nature*, it is one of the **three main environmental threats** to our civilization, along with **climate change** and **pollution**.







What is the Insect Apocalypse?

The **Insect Apocalypse** is the popular name given to the **recent rapid decline** noted for **many species** of insects. This decline may be the cause of declines in other kinds of animals, particularly birds.

What is a Flagship Species?

A flagship species is one that is large, colorful, or charismatic enough to attract widespread public attention. Conservation of these species may help conservation of other species that share the same habitats.

Why is it Important to Save Monarch Butterflies?

Monarch butterflies have unique **ecological** and **cultural importance**. They are important **pollinators**, and their **migrations** link **Canada**, the **United States**, and **Mexico**. They are an important **flagship species**.
